



Economy class seats

Big, comfortable seats, fold-down trays, individual reading lamps, ample legroom




Superliner Roomette

Two reclining seats which convert to a bed; upper berth which folds down from wall, no incabin toilet or shower; restrooms, showers nearby in same train car




Superliner Bedroom

Upper and lower berths, armchair and sofa (converts to lower berth), private sink, vanity, private toilet and shower




Superliner Family Bedroom

he Family Bedroom spans the entire width of the car and has two picture windows. The sofa and two reclining seats convert to beds and the two upper berths fold down from above. Located on the lower level of Superliner sleeping cars, these bedrooms include two adult-sized berths and two child-sized berths.




Viewliner Roomette

Frequently Asked Questions

Are meals included with my sleeping accommodations?

Yes. Sleeping accommodations are considered "Sleeper Service" accommodations aboard Amtrak. As Sleeper Service passengers, you and your sleeping car companions (up to the maximum passenger capacity for your accommodation) are entitled to receive all regular meals as part of your accommodations.

Are there any other perks?

Yes. Sleeping car passengers are entitled to a range of hotel-like amenities, including fresh linen and towel service and complimentary bottled water. In addition, as Sleeper Service passengers, you and your companions enjoy access during your voyage to ClubAcela and Amtrak Metropolitan Lounges located at select stations.
